Second year course options

It's important that you think carefully about which course units you take in your second year, since this will affect what options are available next year and will 'flavour' your final degree and your CV after you graduate.

- Do your course options reflect this?
- Are you going for a broad or a focussed curriculum?
- Are there any third year courses you particularly would like to do... and do your current choices allow you to do this?
- Have you chosen courses that make the most of your abilities? (e.g. how did you perform in related courses last year?)
